Rewarding and exciting careers in nursing begin with the one-year Practical Nursing program at Red River Technology Center.

Students attend 12-months, from July to the following June, and attend class Monday through Friday from approximately 8 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., with clinical hours varying from 5:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., depending on clinical site.

Students must fill out an application packet and test prior to being accepted. Applications may be picked up from the RRTC counselor in the main building. The Practical Nursing program is open to adults who possess a GED or high school diploma. Applicants must take an entrance exam and have a pre-requisite course of medical terminology with a minimum of 45 clock hours, and a grade of B or better. Exam dates are available monthly, from September to April.
