

Rights & Responsibilities of Students Receiving Federal Financial Assistance

The Educational Amendments of 1976 stipulate that in order for a student to receive financial aid under the Pell Grant Program, the institution must determine that the student:

1. Is maintaining satisfactory academic progress in the course of study he or she is pursuing in accordance with the standards and practices of the institution, as indicated in the student handbook, and
2. That the student is not in default on any other National Institutional Financial Assistance Program.

Scholarships

General Information

Financial assistance is available through the Red River Technology Center to adult students. Financial assistance includes grants, scholarships and veterans' benefits.

Federal law requires that any adult student receiving Title IV student assistance funds must have a high school diploma, a GED (General Equivalency Diploma) or have the ability to benefit from the education or training being offered. Prior to enrolling at Red River Technology Center, any adult student who does not possess a high school diploma or GED must take an Ability to Benefit test.

Applying for Assistance

1. Contact the Financial Aid Officer at Red River Technology Center.
2. Obtain and complete the application(s) for specific assistance programs.
3. Return the completed application(s) to the Financial Aid Officer, mail as indicated in application instructions or submit electronically at: www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Rodney J. Love Next Step Scholarship

Who is eligible?

Anyone who meets the following criteria:

- Attend a full-time program
- Have a high school diploma or a high school equivalency diploma

- AND -

- Be within two years of high school graduation

- OR -

- Be actively pursuing* an alternative diploma and be within two years of when your graduating class finished high school

- OR -

- Live in the RRTC School District and have a certificate of eligibility for Veteran's Benefits.

**Actively pursuing indicates that the student is participating in Adult Education classes, registered to take the GED Exam and/or passed the exam within the two year time frame allowed for the tuition scholarship.*

How do I keep the scholarship?

- Maintain at least a B average
- Maintain at least 90 percent attendance
- Make satisfactory progress in the program by passing competencies at designated times

Line of Duty Scholarship

Who is eligible?

Anyone who meets the following criteria:

- Children of Oklahoma peace officers who have given their lives in the line of duty

- Children of Oklahoma firefighters who have given their lives in the line of duty

- Children of Oklahoma emergency medical technicians who have given their lives in the line of duty

- Children of members of the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System who have given their lives in the line of duty, or whose disability is by means of personal and traumatic injury of a catastrophic nature and occurred in the line of duty

**The scholarship shall be limited to a period of five (5) years.*

What are the scholarships worth?

- The scholarship amount will not exceed the cost of tuition per year for full-time or part-time attendance, nor would the amount exceed the actual cost of tuition for a single program. The scholarship does not cover the entire cost of the Practical Nursing program but may be applied, with the student owing the remaining balance.
